NASH COUNTY IS 100% ORGANIZED

Last week Nash County finished organizing all 27 precincts. Congratulations to Laura O'Neal who took this as her personal project. County Commissioner Mary Wells, County Chair Charlotte Mizzelle, and many other Democrats also helped to achieve this goal. It is reported that Nash and Alamance are the only two counties in the state that have all precincts organized. Do you know another county which can be added to this distinguished list?

Monday night the Nash County Executive Committee heard presentations from three candidates to replace the late Barbara Sasser as Register of Deeds. They nominated Anne Melvin who was serving as the acting Register of Deeds.
